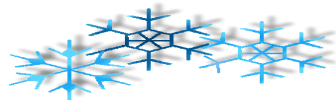

They found that place when the Christine Proudfoot Student Activity Center opened this year. Students could unwind from their crazy school schedule, take a step back and recollect themselves to prepare for the next class.

However, recently students have been avoiding the activity center, in a combination of blasting music, vulgar language, trash, and questionable smells; the student activity center has become unappealing. The activity center hosts an increasingly smaller group of people, leaving everyone else feeling unwelcome. This is a call out to the people still residing in the activity center! But what type of business is it? The kiosk will be run almost entirely by the students of the business class. They will be able to decide what to sell, when to sell, where to sell and even what the business will be called, on their own.

Students will start with some equipment and capital to buy inventory to open. Students will sell their items to the rest of the student body and staff through this kiosk. Goods such as snacks, cold and hot drinks, college supplies, and any other types of product that the students want to sell will be available.

The students will have to determine when to meet to discuss what hours they work at, what to sell, how much to sell it for, and deciding whether or not to hire and fire fellow students based on their performance.

Any profit made by the kiosk is up to the students to distribute: will some go back into the business, will it go to the CMC Foundation, does it go directly to the students, or does it go toward supporting other students?

The remaining equipment will hopefully be received next semester, with the course and kiosk fully operational in the Fall.

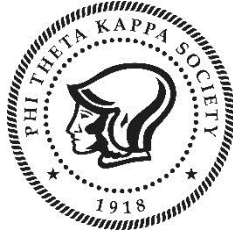

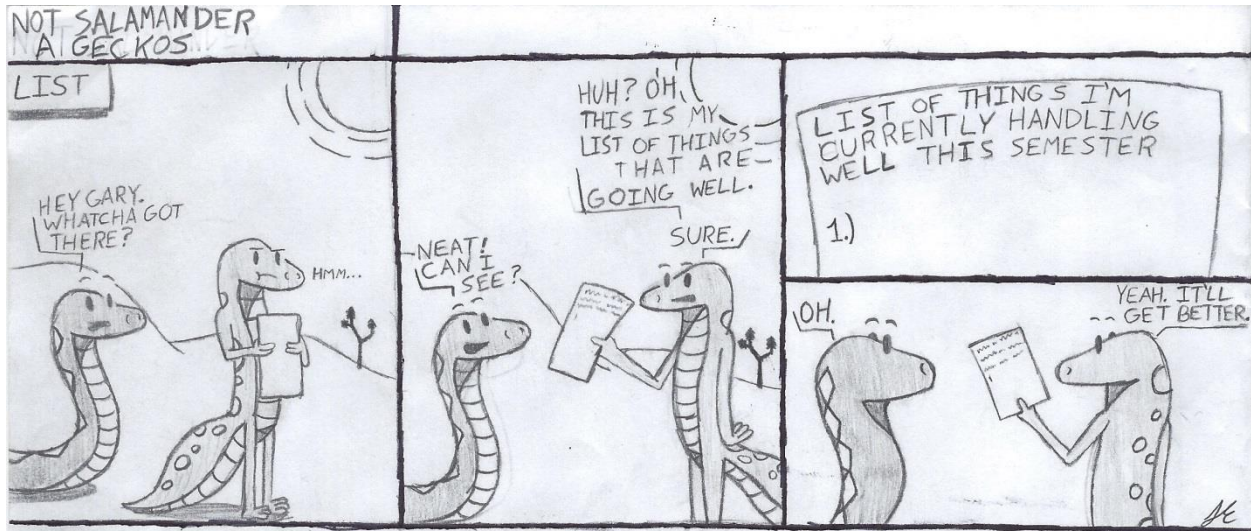
