



Concurrent Enrollment	Dual Enrollment
<p>Concurrent Enrollment is a partnership between a Community College and local high schools (YVHS, TPHS, JSHS, BRHS, virtual academies, home schools) that allows those students who meet the requirements to take <u>college-level courses at the community college, taught by community college instructors.</u></p>	<p>Dual Enrollment is an MOU created between a Community College (CMC) and a School District (MUSD) that allows high school students to take <u>college-level classes, taught by high school teachers at the high school. Classes are closed to non-high school students.</u></p>
<p><b>Enrollment Process</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students must apply to CMC and complete Orientation.</li> <li>• A First Year Plan is <b>not</b> required.</li> <li>• Students must fill out a K-12 Concurrent Enrollment form each semester they are seeking enrollment.</li> <li>• Students must provide high school transcripts each semester.</li> <li>• Parent, and principal or counselor must sign application each semester.</li> <li>• Classes are held at CMC.</li> </ul> <p>Students must have their forms, transcripts, and new student process completed and turned in one week prior to the start of the semester. For Example, Spring 2021 the deadline is January 22<sup>nd</sup>.</p>	<p><b>Enrollment Process</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students are invited to participate in the Dual Enrollment program by their high school – must see a high school counselor.</li> <li>• Students must apply to CMC and complete Orientation.</li> <li>• A First Year Plan is <b>not</b> required.</li> <li>• Classes are held at the high school.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Cost</b> \$46 per unit. Students may file for Financial Aid (FAFSA) to see if they qualify for tuition waiver so they do not have to pay enrollment fees.</p>	<p><b>Cost</b> The high school considers this part of the student’s enrollment in high school, thus no cost.</p>
<p><b>Books</b> Student must purchase books needed for the course.</p>	<p><b>Books</b> Students are provided text books just as they do in high school.</p>
<p><b>Courses</b> Student may pick college-level, not high school-level, courses where they meet the course prerequisites.</p>	<p><b>Courses</b> Student may pick college-level courses available at each high school.</p>
<p><b>Registration</b> Students must register via email or in person at CMC.</p>	<p><b>Registration</b> High schools provide class rosters to CMC and students are registered by CMC Staff.</p>
<p><b>Transcripts/Grades</b> Grades are sent to the student’s high school for recording and will become part of the student’s permanent college record – this will transfer to any college or university.</p>	<p><b>Transcripts/Grades</b> Grades will appear on the student’s high school record and will become part of the student’s permanent college record – this will transfer to any college or university.</p>
