1. Enrolled students with an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) from FAFSA filing of 0-1999 received \$475.00.
2. Enrolled students with an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) from FAFSA filing of 2000+, or students who had not filed a FAFSA but were eligible to do so, received \$350.00.
