- 6 sign ups during kick off – leo worked with Marissa and sent them the students an email today inviting them to the meetings with a link and time and date of the regular meeting. Leo added one additional person to the email that was interested. He used the BCC when sending the email. Joe has been actively inviting classmates. Marissa asked faculty during academic senate and most instructors were willing to give ASCMC the first 5 mins of class to do so. She is going to send out a google form to get feedback to create a script and then they will send an email to faculty for dates as well as working toward making a recruitment video for online students. Joe mentioned appealing to students who are here to just to learn and have fun rather than achieving a degree as well as focusing on the fact that students can see their ideas come to life through joining student government and helping with student led initiatives and using their voice to strengthen the entire CMC Community. They can also sharpen their leadership skills. It is also important to stress that it does not have to be a large time commitment.
