First Level Header

This will be the first major section of your paper. The header will be centered and in bold. If this portion of your paper will be broken down into smaller sections use the headers to indicate that each is a subsection of the pervious heading level. There are five heading levels with each following their own capitalization, bold, italicized, and indentation rules.

Second Level Header

The second level header will be flush with the left margin, be in bold, and all major words are capitalized. The text of this section starts as a new paragraph.

Third Level Header

The third level header will be flush with the left margin, be in bold and italics, and all major words are capitalized. The text of this section starts as a new paragraph.

Fourth Level Header. The fourth level header should be indented .5 inches, in bold, with all major words capitalized, and ending with a period. The text of this section will begin on the same line and continue as a normal paragraph.

Fifth Level Header. The fifth and final level of heading should be indented 0.5 inches, be in bold and italics, all of the major words capitalized, and ending with a period. The text will begin on the same line and continue as a normal paragraph.
