

Quick Start:

Log into MyCMC. On the left side of your screen click on the button that says "Click here to log into Canvas" and it will take you right in.

First click on "Account" where you will create your Profile and choose your Settings & Notifications preferences.

We think you are going to like the Settings options. On the right side of your screen you can choose to have all messages sent as a text to your phone (Other Contacts - Add Contact Method). You can choose how often you want to be notified of your announcements, grading, assignments, etc. You can even upload a profile picture!

Technological Literacy Matters at CMC

Online learning is not just for online or hybrid classes! Any class may be web enhanced.

Many of our classes use Canvas and/or online sites such as MyMathLab, MyLab, MyProgrammingLab, or the textbook publisher's website for assignments, testing, homework, etc. Check the information on your class registration for your course material needs which may require an access card in addition to your textbook.

Common Course Numbering (CCN)

Beginning in Fall 2025, the Common Course Numbering (CCN) system—mandated by the state under initiative AB 1111—will be implemented to simplify student transfers and establish uniform course numbering across all California Community Colleges.

Currently in **Phase 1**, the CCN initiative focuses on aligning course numbers for general education and transfer pathway courses. The system is designed to ensure that comparable courses across community colleges share the same course number, thereby streamlining the transfer process to fouryear institutions and helping students avoid accumulating excess credits.

Courses designated as part of the CCN system will include a "C" in their course numbers (e.g., ENG 003A will become ENGL C1000). Additionally, some subject area prefixes will change to meet statewide standards (e.g., PS will become POLS).

All changes—including updated course numbers and prefixes—will be **clearly noted in the class schedule** to help students identify and navigate the transition with ease.

California Community Colleges are determined to bring down the cost of textbooks.

Learning Modalities

Face-to-Face (F2F)

In-person and on-campus classes with weekly scheduled meeting days and times. Students complete the semester on campus, in person unless the college is ordered to discontinue face-to-face classes. OWL cameras, video recordings of lectures, and Canvas may be utilized to enhance F2F courses.

Online: Synchronous (OS)

Specific days/times: distance education classes with regular weekly meeting(s) during scheduled days and times. Students attend class in Zoom during the published course times. Additionally, students log in to Canvas and complete work regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies are required to complete coursework.

Online: Asynchronous (OAS)

Distance education classes with no scheduled meeting days/times. Students log in to Canvas and complete work regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies are required to complete coursework. Asynchronous online classes will list "TBA" under the Days & Times.

Online: Occasional Meeting (OM)

Distance education classes with occasional Zoom meetings during scheduled days and times. Students occasionally attend class in Zoom on specific days and times listed in the schedule. Additionally, students log in to Canvas and complete work regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies are required to complete coursework.

Hybrid: (HYB)

Distance education classes combined with face-to-face classes that meet in person on specific days and times. Additionally, students log in to Canvas and complete work regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies are required to complete coursework.



Our schedule lists "in-class" hours. In addition, ALL CLASSES also have OUT-OF-CLASS hours.

A typical 3 unit lecture class requires 54 hours of in-class time and 108 hours of out-of-class time for a total of **162 hours**.

When registering for a typical 3 unit lecture class* use the numbers below to help manage your time wisely:

- Regular 16 week semester: 10.2 hours per week
- Condensed 8 week: 20.25 hours per week
- Condensed 5 week: **32.4 hours** per week (summer session)


