## Placed on a waitlist?

During the first two weeks of the semester students on a waitlist may temporarily be allowed to attend the class with the instructor's approval and if seats are available.

This does not entitle the student to enroll in the class.

Should a seat become available, students are notified by email (**to their CMC email address**) in the order they are placed on the waitlist.

Notified students will have until the end of the same business day to enroll or lose their enrollment opportunity to the next student on the list.

All CMC notifications are sent to your CMC email address. This includes registration days & times and waitlist notifications.

## Avoid being dropped from your class

### ATTEND YOUR FIRST CLASS MEETING

It is extremely important that you attend the first class meeting.

- Instructors drop students who do not attend and have not made prior arrangements as a "no-show" for nonattendance.
- If a student is dropped it is the student's responsibility to reregister into the class in the Office of Student Services or online through MyCMC portal.
- There is no priority placement.

### ATTEND & STAY ACTIVE IN YOUR CLASSES

If you stop attending and participating in your class, your instructor may drop you from the class at census.

If you stop attending and participating in class, your instructor will notify Financial Aid who will adjust or discontinue your financial aid.

- This is in compliance with State and Federal regulations.
- If a student is dropped at census they will no longer be able to add a full semester class.

### LOG ON AND BEGIN YOUR ONLINE CLASS

## Learning Modalities

### Face-to-Face (F2F)

In-person and on-campus classes with weekly scheduled meeting days and times. Students complete the semester on campus, in person unless the college is ordered to discontinue face-to-face classes. OWL cameras, video recordings of lectures, and Canvas may be utilized to enhance F2F courses.

### Online: Synchronous (OS)

Specific days/times: distance education classes with regular weekly meeting(s) during scheduled days and times. Students attend class in Zoom during the published course times. Additionally, students log in to Canvas and complete work regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies are required to complete coursework.

### Online: Asynchronous (OAS)

Distance education classes with no scheduled meeting days/times. Students log in to Canvas and complete work regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies are required to complete coursework.

### Online: Occasional Meeting (OM)

Distance education classes with occasional Zoom meetings during scheduled days and times. Students occasionally attend class in Zoom on specific days and times listed in the schedule. Additionally, students log in to Canvas and complete work regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies are required to complete coursework.

### Hybrid: (HYB)

Distance education classes combined with face-to-face classes that meet in person on specific days and times. Additionally, students log in to Canvas and complete work regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies are required to complete coursework.

**Successful online students are great at time management!**

In addition, **ALL CLASSES** also have **OUT-OF-CLASS** hours.

A typical 3 unit lecture class requires 54 hours of in-class time and 108 hours of out-of-class time for a total of **162 hours**.

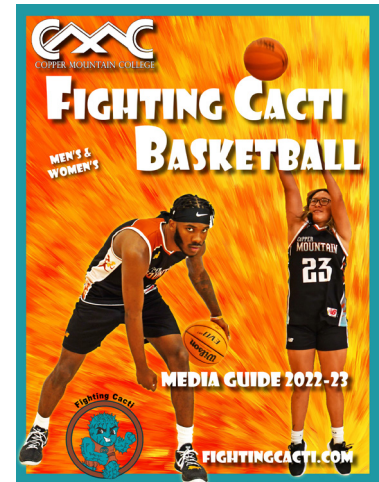

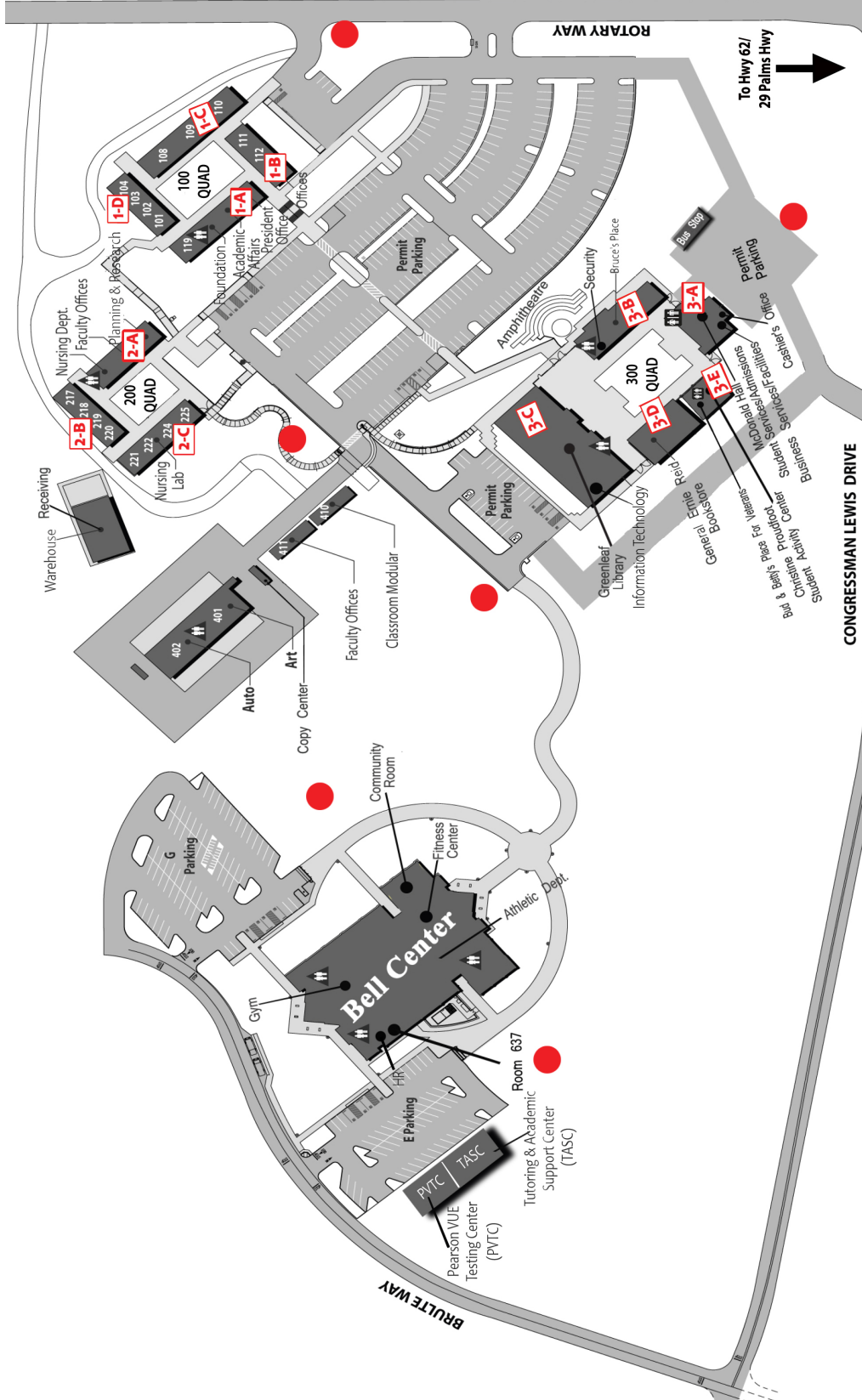
